This text-set aims to provide resources that showcase the diversity of modern day immigrants in the US through a focus on immigrants and refugees throughout the US and particularly communities in Memphis, TN. The text-set challenges preconceptions and stereotypes of immigrants from East Africa, Central America, and the Middle East to not only deepen understanding of the immigrant populations and the refugee experience, but also to help create more inclusive classrooms for these modern day populations to be viewed by teachers and students alike beyond their stereotypes.

Note on Terminology

According to the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, "Refugees are people who have fled war, violence, conflict or persecution and have crossed an international border to find safety in another country." In this text-set we refer to people matching this definition, regardless of their country of origin, as refugees.

Essential Question

How do the representations of immigrants and refugees in this text-set counteract common stereotypes perpetuated by the United States' educational and political systems?

Guided Questions

- 1. The American Dream: How do immigrants and refugees (from past periods in history to modern day) view the American Dream narrative and is it aligned with their goals and motivations for immigrating to the USA, and is it attainable?
- 2. Language/Culture as a Monolith: What different languages, religions, and cultures do you see represented in this text-set? How do these representations complicate preconceptions of one type of immigrant representing many diverse cultures?
- 3. Criminalization/Implied Danger: How do people's motivations for migration to the USA depicted in this text-

- set counteract narratives of them being uneducated, dangerous, and bringing crime?
- 4. Disenfranchisement of Women: How do portrayals of women having agency and independence in this text-set exist in conjunction/alongside devotion to culture, religion, gender norms, and motherhood?
- 5. Resource Intensive/Drains: How do immigrants and refugees contribute to American society? In what ways do they strengthen our communities and develop relationships among each other and their neighbors?

Regionally Specific Suggested Questions: Central America

- 1. When you think of Spanish speaking cultures, what countries do you think of? How do these texts challenge the stereotype of Mexicans as the sole Spanish speaking immigrant in the US?
- 2. How do Central American people's motivations for migrating to the US counteract narratives of them bringing crime?
- 3. Comparative Analysis: Thinking about what immigrants bring/leave behind, what is recognized in the US, what is not How does access to education and jobs differ in the US versus Central American countries? How are education and professions transferred from country of origin into the United States. Are they valued and respected differently?

Regionally Specific Suggested Questions: East Africa

- 1. How do more recent immigrants from Africa experience the US differently from African American's whose ancestors were forced to migrate during the slave trade?
- 2. What languages/ religions/ traditions/ histories/ government structures are present in the 54 different countries making up the African continent?
- 3. How does language study in East Africa differ from language study in the United States? Where do students learn, and what language do they learn in?
- 4. How do immigrants and refugees contribute to American society? In what ways do they strengthen our communities and develop relationships among each other and their neighbors?

Regionally Specific Suggested Questions: Middle East

1. Think and reflect about what you have been taught or what you teach about the Middle East in school. What have you learned

about the Middle East outside of 9/11?

- 2. How do the stories in this text-set add to your understanding of people who come to the US from the Middle East? How do the narratives in this text-set combat the stereotype of people from the Middle East as terrorists?
- 3. How are depictions of women having agency and independence depicted in conjunction/ alongside devotion to the practice of Islam? Can they co-exist or are they mutually exclusive?


