




Focus and Purpose of this Multimedia Text Set


This text set was created to offer current and authentic pieces on immigration. Our students do not identify with white settlers from days gone by. Young adults want materials they can identify with and buy into.




The true story of a Honduran boy who leaves his home in search of his mother who left years before in search of a better life.

Five refugees tell their stories of the terrible events that led them to flee their home and the struggles they encountered along the way.




Sandra Uwiringiyimana's autobiographical account tells the story of her being forced out of her home, surviving a massacre, and trying to navigate her way in the United States.


Young Immigrants in America



A moving, sad, and positive account from the mouth of young undocumented adults in the United States.





In *The Border* readers accompany four young adults on their arduous journey to safety.



Relocation and Deportation




Americanah is the mesmerizing story of Ifemelu who relocates from Nigeria to the USA to attend college and learns how strange it feels to be foreign and black in America.




An impossible love story about two teenagers from two very different cultures meeting in New York and trying to navigate what it means to live in America while facing their futures and deportation..




A YA novel dealing with themes of love, immigration, and (cultural) identity.




